The church's leadership has kept spending well below plan, but we have still had to draw all of our Endowment Spendable Interest to keep our bills current. *As a result, at our current rate of giving, we will soon have to start drawing on our line of credit to make it through year end.*

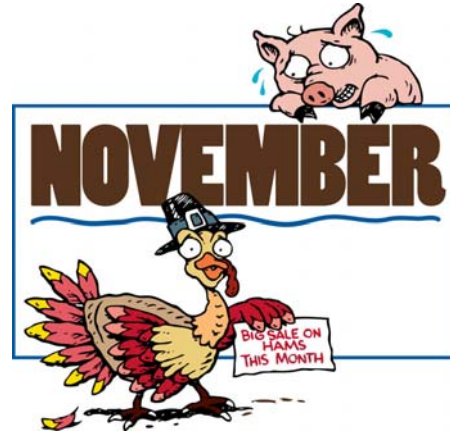
